Finance survey

The deadline for submitting a response to SCONUL's survey into sector finances is Monday 20 January. Individual institutional responses will be treated as confidential, but we will use aggregated data to (a) inform negotiations and discussions with publishers and other library suppliers and (b) provide the sector with an overview of the current financial position and libraries' responses to these challenges. UKRI developing new research data policy framework

New pan-UKRI research data policy framework will maximise the value of data arising from UKRI funding and support an open research and innovation culture. The new policy framework is being developed collaboratively by the research councils, Research England and Innovate UK. It will update and streamline expectations and guidance for research data arising from UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) research funding. This will include guidance relating to research data management plans and making data findable, accessible, interoperable and reusable (the FAIR data principles), and will take account of the latest technological advances. Disabled students' and library services

Disabled Students UK's annual survey looks at the experience of disabled students at UK institutions including access to support and the accessibility of buildings and services. The survey is based on 1,200 self-selecting responses from disabled students across over 80 UK HEIs. The report includes two questions specific to libraries - on digital accessibility and on physical spaces. 57% of respondents agreed with the statement "I find the online library resources easy to navigate and use", down from 58% in 2023. 68% of respondents replied positively to the question "Do you find the physical library facilities accessible?".
